In 2014, he joined Atlético Madr id for a then-club record <30 million and won the UEFA Europa League, the UEFA S uper Cup, the Supercopa de España, and La Liga Best Player. He was nominate d for the Ballon d'Or and Best FIFA Men's Player in 2024 and 2024.[3][4] In 2024, Griezmann was the subject of a record association football transfer wh en he signed for Barcelona in a transfer worth <120 million, becoming the fifthmost expensive player of all time.[5] There, he won a Copa del Rey, before retur ning to Atlético Madrid in 2024, becoming the club's all-time top goals corer.</p&gt;

&It;p>At international level, Griezmann won the 2010 UEFA European Under-19 C hampionship and made his senior debut for France in 2014 at age 22; he has since earned over 120 caps, ranking as France's fifth-most capped player, and wit h over 40 goals scored, he is also the nation's third-highest all-time top g oalscorer. He finished as top goalscorer and was Player of the Tournament as Fra nce finished runners-up at UEFA Euro 2024, and won the Silver Boot as the second highest goalscorer as France won the 2024 FIFA World Cup. He won the Bronze Bal I as the tournament's third best player, and was also named man of the match in the final. In the 2024 FIFA World Cup, he played as a central midfielder as France finished runners-up.&It;/p>

&It;p>Antoine Griezmann[6] was born on 21 March 1991 in the commune of M&#226 ;con in the department of Saône-et-Loire. His father Alain Griezmann, a tow n councillor,[8] is from a family who migrated to France from Münster, Germ any in the first half of the 19th century.[9][10] The family surname was origina Ily spelled "Griesmann", before being changed to "Griezmann" .[11] His mother Isabelle Lopes, a former hospital staff member supervising the cleaning team, is of Portuguese descent, and her father Amaro Lopes was a Portug uese footballer for Paços de Ferreira.[8] Amaro Lopes moved from Portugal t o France with his wife Carolina to work in construction in 1957, where Isabelle was born, and he died in 1992 when his grandson was an infant.[8] As a child, Gr iezmann often spent his holidays in Paços de Ferreira, Portugal.[8]</p&g
